Lab 10: IR Remote Control (2020)

1. Introduction: IR remote control

- Infrared (IR) is a type of electromagnetic radiation with a wavelength longer than that of visible light, but shorter than microwaves.

2. Purpose: The purpose of this lab is to design and build an IR remote control circuit.

3. Theory

- The IR remote control circuit consists of an IR LED, a microcontroller, and a power supply.
- The microcontroller sends a digital signal to the IR LED, which then emits the IR signal.
- The power supply provides the necessary voltage and current for the circuit.

4. Components and Materials

• IR LED: A light-emitting diode that emits infrared light. It is typically made of gallium arsenide (GaAs) or gallium phosphide (GaP).
